SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Inhalation: If symptoms are experienced, remove source of contamination, or move victim to fresh air. Obtain medical advice. Remove person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing.

Ingestion: Seek medical advice if you feel unwell. Do not induce vomiting. Rinse mouth thoroughly with plenty of water. If large amounts have been ingested or discomfort continues obtain medical attention.

Fire hazard: The aerosol containers can pressurise in the case of fire and explode. The propellant may form explosive vapour/air mixtures and promote the spread of fire. 10% Flammable components.

Explosion hazard: Pressurised container: May burst if heated.

Hazardous decomposition products in case of fire: Carbon dioxide. Carbon monoxide. Oxides of nitrogen, hydrocarbons.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Protection during firefighting: Do not attempt to take action without suitable protective equipment. Self-contained breathing apparatus. Complete protective clothing.
